RAIDER BAND SUMMER CAMP FUND DRIVE IS UNDERWAY

A committee of local citizens has started a fund drive to help to send selected Rice High School Raider Band members to a summer camp. The letter sent by the committee to prospective donors follows:

"We have had the best year in the history of our band. Their honors include a first division rating at the fall marching contest as well as three soloists and three ensembles winning first divisions in class one music and going on to represent the band at the state competition in Austin in June. City Gets \$561 Sales Tax Payment

The City of Eagle Lake has received a check for \$561.31 for the one per cent city sales tax collections for the month-long period ending on May 1.

Payments to other area cities were as follows: Columbus \$7,964.00, Weimar \$5,770.21, Hallettsville \$7,389.03, Sealy \$7,449.04 and Wharton \$17,642.53.

The sales tax collections are now refunded by the state controller monthly instead of on the quarter system as in the past.

Mr. Anderson conceded to withdrawing the costs of engineering from the total cost of the project.
