### Memorial Day Celebrated On May 26

Observance of Memorial Day, or Decoration Day, as it was called for many years, was celebrated on Monday, May 26.

The celebration of this day dates from 1868. The graves of the soldiers killed in the Civil War had been decorated with flowers before that year, especially in the South. The women of Columbus, Miss., for example, laid flowers on the graves of both Union and Confederate dead in 1865. On April 26, 1865, Mrs. Sue Landon Vaughn, a descendant of John Adams, the second President of the United States, led some women to the cemetery in Vicksburg and decorated the soldiers' graves there. Also, in May of the same year, some women in Winchester went to the Confederate cemetery, said to be the first cemetery laid out especially for the soldier dead in the South, and decorated the graves with flowers.

Early in May, 1865, Adjutant General Chapman of the Grand Army of the Republic,
