## Red Cross Swim Lessons Begin At Sheridan June 21

Red Cross swimming lessons will be sponsored at the Sheridan Swimming Pool from June 21 through July 3. Registration begins Saturday, June 21 at 8 a.m.

Courses will be offered in the following: beginner, advanced beginner, intermediate, swimmer, basic rescue and water safety, and advanced lifesaving.

Two of the above courses are new. The basic rescue course, designed for eighth year-old swimmers and older, offers personal safety skills that will enable swimmers to meet emergencies if they arise and to provide basic safety information to families and individuals engaged in recreation in, on, and around the water.

Advanced lifesaving is replacing senior lifesaving. Individuals are eligible for lifesaving instruction if they are fifteen years old or older, if they are in sound physical condition, and if they can meet the preliminary swimming test qualifications. There must be a minimum of six people in the class to order for it to be taught.

Classes will be taught by qualified Red Cross Water Safety instructors William C. and Lillian Colkie.

**ASC Committees Given Emerg. Authority**

Authority to determine the need for and eligibility under the emergency conservation measures (ECM) program has been given to the county committees (ASC) by the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced last week.

Subject to availability of funds, an ASC county committee, after consultation with the District Director and state ASC committee may, without prior approval from Washington, implement the ECM program under which eligible farmers may receive federal financial assistance to alleviate conditions resulting from natural disasters and to restore agricultural lands to productive capacity. Formerly the designation of areas for ECM aid was made by the Secretary of Agriculture.

Also, effective immediately with new disaster, eligibility for ECM assistance will be determined on an individual basis, considering the type and extent of damage and the farmer's capability to rehabilitate the damaged farmland.

Department officials expect that these two procedural changes—delegation of program needs determination to county committees and the determination of eligibility on an individual basis—will expedite program assistance on a more timely basis. The changes will enable a farmer suffering severe damage to his farmland to receive program aid even though damage in his county is not widespread.
