### More Heavy Rains Hit This Area

More heavy rains fell in this area bringing another three to six inches of rainfall during Sunday and Monday and Tuesday morning.

The rainfall fell in various degrees over the county but the Altair and Eagle Lake areas had some of the heaviest measurements. Heavy rain in high wind hit the Altair area Monday morning, in the city measurement for the week-end was just over three inches.

The four inches fell in the Altair area and almost two inches at the lake plant of the Lake Side Irrigation Co. It is hard to determine the amount of damage this rain and that of a week previous have done to crops since the rains were so heavily scattered.

Damage is expected to many crops and many gardens have been ruined by the heavy rains.

So far the lake plant of the Lake Side Irrigation Co. had recorded a total of 22.05 inches for the period ending June 10th well over the normal amount in this area. The lake plant measured 1.87 inches in January, 1.30 in February, 1.51 in March, 3.78 in April, 11.55 in May, and 2.04 so far in June.

### Test For WCJC Voc. Nurses Course Friday

A bright employment outlook is indicated for students completing the Vocational Nursing course at Wharton County Junior College in Wharton.

"We have never had a student that could not be placed in a job," states Mrs. Helen Pickett, R. N., department chairman.

A pre-entrance test for prospective students will be administered this Friday, June 13th at 8:00 a.m. in room 214 of the J. R. Peace Bldg.

The aptitude test is required for all students but no appointment is required as the test fee is money refunded to the student upon successful completion of the course.

The WCJC vocational nursing program consists of a 20 week period in classroom studies and 52 week period of clinical study which includes four to five days training per week in a hospital and one day of classroom study.

Tuition is \$75 per semester for in-district residents and \$100.75 for non-district students. Loans and grants to cover the two semesters are available from the WCJC Financial Aid office.

### Swim Lessons At Sheridan Begin June 21

Red Cross swimming lessons will be sponsored at the Sheridan Swimming Pool from June 21 through July 3. Registration begins Saturday, June 21 at 8 a.m.

Lessons will be offered in the following: beginner, advanced beginner, intermediate, swimmer, basic rescue and water safety, and advanced lifesaving.

Two of the above courses are new. The basic rescue course, designed for eleven year-old swimmers and older, offers personal safety skills that will enable swimmers to meet an emergency if they arise and to provide basic safety information to families and individuals engaged in recreation in, on, and around the water.

Advanced lifesaving is replacing senior lifesaving. Individuals are eligible for lifesaving instruction if they are fifteen years of age or older. If they are in sound physical condition, and if they meet the preliminary swimming test qualifications. There must be a minimum of 50 hours of instruction for it to be taught.

Classes will be taught by qualified Red Cross Water Safety instructors William G. and Lillian Gohke.

### Calling All Homemakers

Play It Safe In Water

Water play is fun and educational for children—but only when they learn to "play it safe".

Adults must closely supervise water play activities. Water that is two to three inches deep is just as dangerous to very young children as deeper water.

When children congregate in the backyard to swim in washbasins, play with the water hose or swim in the pool, be conscious of water safety.

Wading pools or larger pools should be fenced. Insist that flotation belts or life jackets be used by all children. If a neighbor's child fishes about safety precautions, insist that he get out of the water—tell him it is to better advantage.
