POSTAL SERVICE IN THE NEWS THESE DAYS

The U.S. Postal Service has been making lots of news lately. The Postal Service announces that beginning July 1, 1975 new Post Office Box rental rates will go into effect. New rates are posted in the lobby of the Post Office.

Class post offices, which serve about 2 million families, should be phased out. This is at present only a recommendation and no action has been taken on any closings in this area at this time.

Postmaster Gen. Benjamin F. Ballar has said that the price of the first class stamp must go up to 13 cents to meet the increased cost of mail delivery.

The General Accounting Office said recently that 12,000 rural post offices should be closed to save \$100 million annually. A move GAO said could be made without reducing postal service.

GAO, Congress' auditing agency, recommended that two-thirds of the nation's 6,100 fourth class and 12,190 third class offices be closed.

Sawyer Asks Accounting In Truckard Contract

A civil suit was filed in District Court at Columbus June 20th by Herbert A. Sawyer against Francis J. Truckard asking for an accounting of the contract and termination of a contract to feed and sale of cattle.

Sawyer alleges in the suit that he and Truckard entered into an agreement on March 28, 1974 in which he (Sawyer) was to purchase and pay for livestock and Truckard was to feed and sell the livestock and the plaintiff says he was to receive 15% of his investment or one-half of the net proceeds.

Truckard was to pay \$3,558.08 to the defendant on June 15th, 1975 but did not and later promised to pay \$1000 per week beginning June 15, 1976, but again failed to do so, says the plaintiff.

He asks that the court require an accounting for the livestock sold and that the plaintiff recover losses, costs of court and other relief. The parties agree that the suit is between the two parties be terminated.

DPS Says 54 To Die 4th of July Weekend

The director of the Texas Department of Public Safety has estimated that traffic accidents in the state over the July 4th holiday weekend will claim 54 lives.

Colonel Wilson E. Speir said his department expects travel will be heavy in Texas over the holiday period, particularly in and around recreational areas such as lakes and beaches.

He added that the estimate covers a 78-hour period starting on Thursday, July 3 at 8 a.m. and continuing until midnight Sunday, July 6. "Last year during a 108-hour Independence Day celebration, 46 people died in traffic mishaps in Texas."

Speir also pointed out that highway traffic deaths are about 25 per cent over total at this time one year ago. "This is due to increased travel and somewhat higher speeds," he added.

In a concerted effort to help keep deaths down, the DPS and local law enforcement agencies will be cooperating in the all-out effort to make the streets and highways as safe as possible. All available DPS troopers will be on duty. Speir said, and they will be especially watchful for drinking drivers, speeders and reckless drivers driving in a careless manner.
