- Traffic will turn in from the east only off of Main Street into the drive-in lanes. The City Council requests no left turns off of Main Street.
  - The drive-in lanes will accommodate six vehicles at one time. If the lanes are full, customers are requested to circle the block and try for later entry.
  - All vehicles over 7' - 10" high cannot enter the drive-in lanes. All vehicles with extension mirrors are requested to use the outer lane (lane no. 2) served by the remote island unit.
  - Traffic may drive up to either the window or the remote island. Two customers can be waited upon at the same time.
  - These facilities are primarily being activated for personal account customers for deposits, withdrawals, or note payments when accompanied by coupon book, and not for commercial or business accounts requiring large withdrawals of currency and coins.

  - Immediately upon completion of the transaction traffic should proceed out the rear door of the facilities and turn either right or left to exit on to Jones or Commerce Street.
