\$500,000 Gift Made to WCJC Bldg. Program

The new building is an integral phase of the college's efforts toward expansion as a result of population growth and society's increasing quest especially for occupational education.

The Foundation commitment, to be given in grants of \$100,000 each for five years beginning in January of 1976, is the largest amount ever received by the college from a single individual at one time.

"I have heard very good reports about Wharton County Junior College," Mrs. Johnson told Dr. Theodore Nickstick, Jr., president of the college. Her husband, a prominent Gulf Coast rancher and real estate developer, died in 1971.



Cattle Price Outlook Gloomy

What's in store for cattlemen as far as prices are concerned for the remainder of 1975?

"Although there's optimism in some circles due to current stronger market prices and increased in cattle feeding, it's a little early for cattlemen to begin cheering," contends Dr. Ed Uvacek, livestock marketing specialist for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station.

"In fact, producers may be in for another drop in market prices as the year moves along."

So Uvacek advises cattlemen to market or contract calves early and cull old cows as soon as possible.

What are the reasons for Uvacek's gloomy outlook? "First of all, the supply of grain-fed beef should increase during the second half of the year. Fed cattle marketings are expected to reach 200 million head in the first six months of 1976, compared to 185 million in 1975.

Increased cow liquidations will also boost the total beef supply. Uvacek expects cow slaughter to increase 42 per cent during the last half of 1975 compared to the first six months of the year.

More beef will also result from large kills of non-fed steers and heifers and calves. Slaughter of non-fed steers and heifers is expected to be up 42 per cent during the last half of the year while calf slaughter should be up almost 70 per cent, according to the Texas A&M University System specialist.

Wildcat Oil Test Staked NE of Eagle Lake

A new oil and gas drilling location north, northeast of Eagle Lake is the highlight of oil and gas activity in this area. El Rey Petroleum Inc. of Fort Worth will drill the No. 1 Frack Hens to 10,000 feet on a 640-acre lease in Section 434, E. C. Ward Survey A-219 seven miles north-northeast of this city.

It was also reported that the Victor B. Russak Jr. of Houston is drilling a 6,850-foot test on a 154-acre lease in the Samuel Kennelly Survey A-30 six miles northwest of Garwood. The well is the No. 1 John H. Hudson in the Englehart Field.

Also Marine Contractors Supply Co. of Houston will rework the No. 1 Yuck-Williams in the Englehart Field, 4.5 miles west, northwest of Garwood on an 80-acre lease in Section 20, 16GN RR Co. Survey A-268.
