Or the same family—under a liberal-cost food plan—can buy a week's food for \$71.70. Asked why many families estimate food costs way above the \$47.90 figure, experts say that if these figures appear ridiculously low to some people, it may be because they're buying more "ban food" at the supermarket.

The \$48 figure does not include costs of non-food items, such as milk, eggs, and other "extras" that are necessary to make a meal.

"Deals" take many forms—and most of them increase the amount people spend at the supermarket.
