for a slight additional fee. Robison pointed out that this will give local viewers the advantages of seeing network as well as independent programs and should be a big advantage especially to the sports fans, since activities in Houston that are blacked out may be seen from Austin or vice-versa.

No television antennas will be required, if owners wish to continue their antennas as a standby basis, they may do so but will be required to remove the cable television hookup and replace this with leads from their TV sets.

The cable television company has already installed some 25 miles of cables on CPL and Southwestern Bell poles in the area and will begin a promotion soon to sign up subscribers and at that time the hook-ups will be made into the homes. Robison emphasized again that this service is optional and is not mandatory if viewers wish to continue with the receiver they now have.

Since the minimum wage under federal law on January 1st will become \$2.20 per hour the district's increases put the pay within those requirements.

In other action the board readjusted the schedule of pay for extra-curricular trips by bus drivers; and equalized salaries of boys and girls coaches so as to meet new Federal law.

Effective July 21, 1975, Title 9 of the Federal Education Amendment states that the district cannot discriminate in salaries due to sex. Hence the salaries of coaches of boys and girls with similar duties were equalized to fall within this new Federal requirement. The result is that some of the girls' coaches, especially in basketball and track were raised to the same level of boys' coaches in the pay schedule with equal duties.

The board also approved an increase in the pay for substitute teachers. In the past the pay for substitute teachers has been \$16 per day for non-degreed teachers and \$20 for degreed teachers, and in the 1975-76 school year,
