10 DWI Cases Tried In County Court

A total of sixteen cases were handled in the June term of the County Court when Judge Lester J. Crank presiding. Ten of the cases were on charges of driving while intoxicated. Seven cases were dismissed on motion of the state. In addition to the DWI charges, the court heard a charge of theft and he was ordered to make restitution. A charge of theft against Marvin Cook, one for wife desertion against Joe J. Zapalac, one for driving with license suspended against Macdonald G. Melendez, charges of theft and possession of marijuana against Ernest Gen Kelly and possession of marijuana and fraud against Jo Ann Berry were dismissed. Entering pleas of guilty to DWI charges and sentencing during the term were: Macdonald G. Melendez, fined \$100, 90 days in jail, one year probation on jail sentence; Leroy A. Kuhnank, fined \$270 and 30 days in jail, probation for one year on jail sentence; Kenneth Robert-White, \$180 fine and 30 days, one year probation on jail sentence; Odell William Kerr, defendant failed to appear, \$120 fine and 30 days in jail, one year probation, warrant for arrest issued.

Financial Aid Available At WCJC

Student Financial Aid Officer Frank Norton emphasizes that there is ample financial assistance and time for those who need it in order to enroll at Wharton County Junior College in Wharton this fall. The amount of Basic Educational Opportunity Grant money has increased over last year and applications may be obtained at WCJC. Rules and regulations have been relaxed as far as some sources of income (such as social security benefits) so that students who may not have been eligible for the 1974-75 year can now qualify. Certain financial criteria are to be met to receive a grant. As a general guideline, if a student's family income in 1974 was \$12,000 (for a family of four) or less, they may receive a grant. The amount of the Basic Grant is determined on the basis of students' and families' financial resources. A full staff of WCJC Counselors and Financial Aid Officers provides services to prospective students during regular hours weekdays. A smaller counseling staff is also on duty Saturdays mornings from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for those who may work during the week. Early registration continues through August 15, especially designed to help those who may experience situational, developmental or personal problems in planning their future.
