Friday To Accept Paving Bids

7 BID ON PAVING

Bids were received on proposed paving and seal-coating projects from a total of seven bidders although some did not bid on all items on the bid sheet.

After the bids were opened and read, the council authorized Mayor Elmer Struss to call a meeting at 8:00 p.m. this Friday, July 11th for the sole purpose of accepting bids deemed most advantageous to the city. Notices of such special meeting were posted at the city hall prior to the 10-day deadline required by state statutes under the Open Meetings Law.

Since some of the bidders quoted only for the seal-coat work, some for hot-mix-paving and some for all of the work, it was necessary that comparisons be made on the work planned in order to determine the successful bidders, which it will be carried out to complete these figures and have them ready for consideration of the council Friday night.

Mayor Struss told the council that funds for the paving work are set aside in the budget, but the extent to which it will be carried out depends on costs after completion of the bids received.

Former Resident

Bayne Charged

With Murder

Surrenders After

8-Hour Seige Thurs.

Cleve Bayne, 47, of Houston and a former resident for several years while operating the White House Hotel and Cafe, surrendered to Houston officers last Thursday after a seige of nearly eight hours following the shooting of his estranged wife, Ann, also 47. She was found to death with a pistol outside her apartment at 1809 Brun St. in Houston Thursday morning.

Police traced Bayne, a resident at 210 Wynne St. in Houston, to his daughter's home at 5111 Karcher in North Houston where he barricaded himself in the home with a rifle and more than 30 rounds of ammunition. The rifle reportedly was the same one which he had in his possession in 1971 when he climbed atop the Starvation-Lincoln Hotel and threatened to kill himself because his wife had left him. He was finally subdued and underwent psychiatric examination but was not charged in the 1971 incident.

Special Weapons and Tactics police officers walked outside the home of Bayne's daughter, Mrs. Henry White, while family members talked to him through a window and over the telephone before he finally surrendered.

Bayne was a salesman for an ice cream firm when he and his wife came to Eagle Lake to take over management of the White House Hotel. He was a food salesman at the time of the shooting Thursday at 8 a.m. He and his wife had been married for 31 years.

He has been charged with murder and is being held without bond pending further hearing in the incident.

The pretty lake-side drive of El Camino was the low bidder on furnishing, hauling and machine spreading Type CC Mix (Cold premix) on a bid of \$12 per ton. His also offered to provide a steel wheel roller for \$9 per hour and a motor grader and operator for \$13 per hour.

Dean-Keng Paving of Old-dings bid low for furnishing, hauling, and spreading rock and aggregate with a bid of \$18.94 per cubic yard. He offered cold mix for \$10.50 per ton; Type D hot mix for \$21.50 per ton; MCI Prime oil at 54¢ per gallon, OA-175 asphalt at 44¢ per gallon; a roller for \$12 and grader for \$12.50 per hour.

Dean-Keng added that price increases received in costs of supplies would be passed on to the city.

Bramon Contracting of Victoria offered aggregate for \$15 yard, MCI oil for 60¢, OA-175 asphalt for 60¢, the roller for \$10 and did not bid on the grader.

Brown and Root of West Columbia offered aggregate for \$18.45 yard, cold mix for \$17.10 ton, hot mix for \$22.35 ton, prime oil for 58¢, asphalt for 54¢, a roller for \$12 and grader for \$12.50 per hour.

Schwabe-Mikes of Shiner offered aggregate for \$15 yard, MCI oil for 60¢, OA-175 asphalt for 60¢, the roller for \$10 and did not bid on the grader.
