

# Bigger College Bills Face Parents

For young men and young women in Colorado County who want to go to college this year, getting enrolled will not be as difficult as in other years. With registrations running below normal at many colleges, there is ample room for them.

The big problem, for the prospective students and their parents, is how to pay for it. Since last year, tuition costs have gone up considerably, so has the cost of room and board.

Colleges have been forced to raise their rates in order to meet the higher cost of fuel, food, labor and materials.

According to a nationwide poll of 2,400 colleges and universities, conducted by the College Entrance Examination Board, students will have bills that are 6 to 8 percent above last year's.

Those attending four-year private colleges will be paying an average of \$4,200, or \$232 more than before. At four-year public colleges it will average \$3,079, which is \$379 more. Sizeable increases are also noted at two-year colleges, especially public ones.

Based upon the new rate schedules and the number of students expected to be admitted, Colorado County parents will be shouldering a \$1,874,000 load for the coming academic year.

This will cover tuition, fees, room and board, books, transportation and miscellaneous expenses.

## July 25-31 Set As Farm Safety Week

The week of July 25 through 31 has been proclaimed as National Farm Safety Week, and this year's theme is "Planning Prevents Accidents".

Choice steers — 400 to 500 lb. to \$20 per head; 400 to 550 lb. fat sucking calves brought 28 to 34 and dry lot calves in the 500 to 600 lb. group 38 to 40.

The market was two to four cents per pound lower on all classes of cattle, except slaughter bulls which were steady to one cent lower, at the Wharton County Livestock Market Sale Wednesday, July 16. The firm handled 700 head of cattle.

Weather conditions continue favorable for the spread of the tenacious screwworm, and livestock producers in Colorado County should keep on the alert for possible cases in their herds.

Screwworm cases have been increasing by leaps and bounds in South and Southwest Texas, and the files are continuing to move out to other areas of the state. So, it's vital to check animals regularly, treat all types of wounds, and submit all worm samples for identification.
