Edwin Gay of Eagle Lake Insurance Agency, board member, says the district will be insured by the district, Mr. Griffith and Mr. Gay, will share in the proceeds from the premiums with Mr. Griffith receiving a larger percentage for handling and coordinating the program. He told the district that all buildings and equipment in the district are covered to value to \$4,422,000. Last year the values totaled \$4,189,000 but this was increased by 10% this year, except at the Garwood school where the old building was removed and values reduced by \$158,700 because of this.

**SCHOOL LUNCH AID**

Supt. E. A. Krivicka reported that the district will receive a reimbursement from the federal government of 12.5¢ for each Type A school lunch served in 1975-76 and will receive reimbursement of 66.7¢ for each free lunch served under the federal school lunch program. The board accepted the recommendation of the superintendent, new salary schedule under the new school financing program for the fiscal year beginning in 1975-76 and for the secretaries to the superintendent and business manager, increasing their pay grade one notch. Also, a classification of the elementary school principals was changed to make more state assistance available without altering the funds actually received by the principals.
