

County's Families Own More Cars

Car ownership stands at a high level in Colorado County, the figures show.

Despite the fact that purchases of new cars have dropped far below normal in the last year or two, locally and in all other sections of the country, the actual number of cars in operation in the area is greater than ever.

The answer is, in part, that more families are retaining their old cars, when buying new ones, than was the case a few years ago. Other families, who were not in the market for new cars during the past year, have taken to fixing up their present models to keep them going longer.

As a result, the average age of today's passenger cars is close to 5.5 years, as against 5.5 years in 1969.

Permit OK'd For Nuclear Plant At Bay City

The four partners in the proposed \$1.1 billion nuclear power plant project in Matagorda County, near Bay City, have been advised that a permit has been granted for limited work on the plant to be known as the South Texas Project.

Plans are being developed on a timetable for the preliminary construction work on the plant.

The partners include Houston Lighting and Power, Central Power and Light Co., and the cities of Austin and San Antonio.

The permit for preliminary construction was granted last Tuesday from the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission to begin limited work on the project. The permit allows such activities as road building, excavating, clearing and grading on the plant site, 12 miles south of Bay City on the west bank of the Colorado River.
