EDITORIAL SPEAKING

SCREW WORM SURGE CONTINUES

(By P. Johnnie Cooper, County Extension Agent)

Screwworms - Screwworms! That's about all Texas livestock producers are hearing these days. And the situation will probably get worse in the coming weeks as peak fall build-ups occur.

The current year is shaping up as the worst in total number of confirmed screwworm cases since the disastrous 1972. Cases totaled 1,164 in June, 1,383 in July, and as of Aug. 10 the 1975 Texas total stood at 3,775. The seven-month total for 1975 was a monumental 34,492 cases.

With the sterile fly prevention program at the Screwworm Eradication Lab at Mission operating at maximum capacity, the main responsibility for keeping screwworm numbers under control rests on the shoulders of the producers.

Herds should be checked regularly and worm samples from infested wounds should

The Sealy delegation which also includes Billy Schavda, the Sealy Co. president, and Wilma Peterson of the Sealy News. The Sealy group will provide programs and sound equipment and the tickets.

The Eagle Lake to Sealy farm to market road is 15.2 miles in length and shortens the distance between the two cities from about 28 to 21 miles and provides a new route to the southern portion of Houston via IH 10.

Contract was let for construction of the FM road in December of 1971 at a total cost of \$2,485,969.89. Jarbet Co. of San Antonio was given the contract for the 8.6 mile portion in Colorado County at a cost of \$1,147,522.47 and E. H. Rotary Hears Principal Talk On Changes At Primary School

Eagle Lake Primary School Principal H. M. Benge was the speaker at the meeting of the Eagle Lake Rotary Club on Wednesday of last week and he discussed some of the changes that have come about in education of youngsters on the primary level.

Earl Rodgers was program chairman for the day.

Mr. Benge noted that the school and the faculty have to face up to new problems and changes constantly. He cited that "television provides competition for the teachers and they must develop program to keep situation and awareness of the students in order to keep them stimulated and interested in their school work."

He told the Rotarians that in the Eagle Lake Primary School the ethnic ratio among the 394 students who graduated early last week, was 36.5 per cent Anglo-Americans, 32.2 per cent blacks, and 31.2 per cent Latin-Americans. He added that the ratio of boys to girls shows that 58.3 per cent of the enrollment are boys and 41.7 per cent are girls.

Some of the changes in education discussed by the principal included: phonics, which he said is now in better perspective and is more appealing to the child's education; teacher guides which aid the teacher in developing her programs; audio-visual aids and handouts which aid in the effort of putting "another teacher in the classroom."
