## Suit Asks Deed Be Set Aside

A suit was filed in District Court Aug. 20th by Sharon Vander against Ralph Chambers, both of Harris County, seeking to set aside a deed which the woman allegedly gave to Chambers, an attorney while she was incarcerated in the Harris County jail. She alleges that on June 27, 1975 while in the Harris County jail and under great

stress and unable to think clearly, she signed an instrument which she said she thought was bond security for her release from jail. She says in the petition that the instrument actually conveyed to the attorney interest in lands in Colorado County as follows:

One-twelfth undivided interest in 55.5 acres in the John Stafford Survey Ab. 756 in this county; one-twelfth undivided interest in 311 acres in the B. Deason Survey, Abst. 5 in this county; and one-twelfth undivided interest in 202.9 acres in the H. Wegenduber Survey Abst. 0791 in this county,

all part of the John Perry Estate.

She asks the court to rule that the deed is void and to rescind the deed. She alleges that she did not intend to sign a deed to the property and since she has dismissed the attorney and he rendered little or no services. As an alternative the woman asks that she be awarded damages in the amount of value of the land, estimated in excess of \$40,000, plus costs of court and other relief.
