Standardized Tests To Be Offered

Rice students have a chance to take many standardized tests during the '75-'76 school year.

Freshmen, the Otis-Lennon Mental Ability Test is being offered in September and the Iowa Test of Educational Development, the (ITED) is being offered in September and October.

Sophomores and juniors are only being offered one test, the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT), and for Juniors, the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualification Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

Seniors may take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) in November, and the Betty Crocker Search for the Homeemaker of Tomorrow in December, and Advanced Placement exams in May.

Also, students in premium classes may take premium level standardized tests in May in place of the final exam.
