The deadline for registering to vote in the special Texas Constitution Amendment Election to be held on November 4th, 1975 is Friday, October 3rd, 1975.

If you voted in an election since 1971, you are eligible and are registered. If not, guarantee your right to this important vote by contacting the county clerk office in Columbus or Mrs. Elizabeth Booth, Legislative Secretary, 2000 E. 10th Street, Austin, Texas 78702.

### Def. Driving Needs Renewal In 3 Yrs.

State Insurance Board Chairman Joe Christie last Tuesday said 25,000 Texas drivers could forfeit substantial insurance discounts this fall. Christie said drivers who completed the National Safety Council's Defensive Driving Course in the Fall of 1972 will lose their eligibility to a 10 percent discount on insurance premiums unless they re-take the course. He said the discount program, established by the State Board of Insurance, is valid for a three-year period, but former DDC graduates can re-new their eligibility for another 10 percent by re-taking the course.
