I feel that what children from infancy to pre-school age need (and have the right to) is not a license to work (if necessary to work) in love, care, discipline, and as close to a home environment as is possible; these are the things I have always strived for and have felt more than a little pride in giving to the children whom I have been given the privilege to care for. My little ones are as much at home in my home as they are in their own.

New the new Child Care Licensing Act, Senate Bill No. 965, signed by the Governor on June 21, 1975, to become effective January 1, 1976, says I must be a Registered Day Care Home. I am willing to be registered in Austin; I will have medical records on all the children in my care. I will happily comply with the fact of both my husband and myself having a yearly medical checkup. Work Starts On Matagorda Nuclear Plant



WORK BEGINS AT PLANT SITE

Work began on the site of Matagorda County's nuclear power station Monday morning, September 22, 1975.

Brown & Root, Inc., architect/engineer and constructor for the billion-dollar project, began moving dirt and setting up construction facilities at the site midway between Palacio and Bay City.

About forty management personnel will lead a work force which will build to about one thousand in 18 months. A maximum of 2,100 workers will be on site when construction reaches its height in 1978.

A Limited Work Authorization (LWA) was granted by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission August 12. Actual plant construction will begin upon receipt of the Construction Permit which will be expected in early 1976.

The LWA allows for such items as road work, parking lots, construction buildings, electric power and sewage treatment, and dewatering facilities at the 12,300-acre site west of the Colorado River. Also allowed are excavation work, construction of the cooling reservoir, and visitor center.

The plant will have a 7,000-acre closed-cycle cooling reservoir and should go into operation in 1980 with the first of two Westinghouse pressurized water reactor systems. A second 1250-megawatt unit will follow in 1982. -CPL South Texas Project "UPDATE"

4 New Drilling

Cities Service Oil Co. of Houston is due to rework the No. 2 Kridler five miles north-west of Eagle Lake on a 300-acre tract. The well is located on Survey A-51.

The Columbus test is Prairie Producing Co. of Houston No. 4 C. G. Glascock six miles south-southwest of Columbus on a 400 acre lease in the John Collier Survey, A-148 in the Glascock Field. The well is projected to 10,500 feet.

Four new drilling locations, at Altair, Eagle Lake, Garwood and Columbus, highlight oil and gas activity in this area. They include:

Golding Production Co. of Houston will drill the No. 1 Wm. K. Lebrun on a 160-acre lease in the 16GN RR Survey 29, A-277 as an 8,700 foot wildcat five miles southwest of Altair.

Teal Petroleum Co. of Houston has staked the No. 1 Schilling in the Mustang Creek Field six miles north-northwest of Garwood. The well will be a 4300 foot test on a 160-acre lease in the 16GN RR Survey 23, A-281.
