Info Needed With Hot Check Warrants

Recently the Sheriff's Office has received warrants for persons writing "Hot Checks" in our area. I would like to remind our citizens to take precautions when they accept a check from someone. Be sure and get a driver's license number, address, and/or a Social Security number. We must have this information when we mail a warrant out of the county to another law enforcement agency. Without this information the possibility of having these persons arrested and brought to justice is very small.

Also, I would like to remind all vehicle operators that the law "requires" all vehicles to stop when meeting a stopped school bus. You must stop if you are behind the bus or meeting one. We have had numerous complaints of which operators violating this law. Please help us safeguard our school children.
