Clipson New Commissioner For TCA

TEXAS SUPREME COURT JUSTICE

Justice Jack Pope officiated at the inauguration ceremonies held in Austin, October 28, for the two new commissioners of the Texas Commission on Alcoholism (TCA). Jim Clipson, Jr. of Eagle Lake and Bill Masterson of Odessa took their oaths of office for a six-year term which will expire June 1, 1981, with the six-member governing commission of that state agency. Governor Dolph Briscoe appointed Clipson and Masterson to TCA to replace Donald G. Austin, Jr. of Chappel Hill and Charles G. Guy of Lubbock whose terms had expired. Other members of the commission are Roy J. Gorman of Austin, E. G. Emerson of San Antonio, Melvin Furman, M.D. of Corpus Christi, and Lee D. Hering of Grand Prairie.

The commission, which was created in 1953, is charged with the planning and coordination of the prevention, treatment, and control of alcohol abuse and alcoholism throughout Texas. To this end, the commission is authorized to administer all federal funds available to Texas under Public Law 91-616 and 93-282, "Funding the state fiscal year, more than 38 community and regional alcoholism programs were provided through the efforts of Texas through this statewide network of services.

Following the ceremonies, Clipson stated, "I am grateful to Governor Briscoe for appointing me to TCA. I have been quite familiar with alcoholism problems on the local and state level and know the size of the problem, but I do think that I can be of help to you all in this effort."

Clipson, who was born in Wharton County, Texas, has been in Eagle Lake since 1948 and has been involved in rice farming and ranching in Colorado County since 1960. He is a past president of the Eagle Lake Rice Club, a member of the local Lions Club, a charter member of the Eagle Lake chapter of the Colorado County Volunteer Ambulance Corporation; a member of the American Rice Growers' Association and American Rice, Inc., as well as being a supporter of the Houston cattle Association. He is also a member of the El Campo Production Credit Association; is an officer in the First Presbyterian Church of Eagle Lake.

Active in the political as well as the civic and volunteer areas, Clipson has been chairman of the Colorado County Republicans since 1966. He worked extensively in the campaigns for Senator John Tower and former Congressman George Bush.

Clipson resides with his wife Jane Katherine and their four children, Julie, Julie, Jennie and Jimmie, at Eagle Lake.

Six Cases Tried, Two Dismissed In County Court

Six cases were tried and two others dismissed in the October session of county court with Judge Lester J. Crane presiding.
