Thanksgiving Day is a national holiday of the United States and Canada. The first Thanksgiving was observed in 1621 by the Pilgrims and Indians in Plymouth Colony in Massachusetts. Declared by Governor William Bradford, it was a day of feasting and expression of gratitude for the harvest.

George Washington issued the first national proclamation of Thanksgiving in 1779. Through the crusading efforts of Mrs. Sarah J. Hale, editor of "Godey's Lady's Book," Abraham Lincoln made it a national holiday and fixed the day as the last Thursday in November. Congress in 1941 set it as the fourth Thursday.

The turkey, a native American bird, and pumpkin pie are among the foods traditionally eaten at Thanksgiving.

In Canada the day is observed on the second Monday in October.
