as the result of injuries received when struck by a truck being backed by Good on the defendant firm's property.

The petition alleges that Cowan was standing near a truck when he was struck by the backing vehicle. It also alleges that Tapis was operating a truck on the same premises and did not give fair warning to Cowan.

Cowan was 57 and the petition says that he had a life expectancy of 20 years and \$500,000 is asked for loss of earnings; another \$250,000 for being deprived of protection, comfort, counseling and services of the deceased; \$1800.00 for funeral expenses; \$350,000 for mental anguish suffered by the deceased prior to his death en route to Eagle Lake Community Hospital; at least \$100,000 for care, maintenance, counseling, etc. of two children; and an additional \$100,000 for exemplary damages.

The suit was filed in district court this week by George Walchar seeking judgment for a \$5,940.05 refund due to him; \$20,000 in damages; and \$2000 in attorney's fees from Reginald W. Gregory, individually and as Gregory Export and Financial Corp.

Mr. Walchar alleges that he entered into a contract with Gregory to provide corn shocks on June 21, 1973 and placed deposits of \$5,361.65 to insure delivery. He says that no deliveries have been made since Mar. 12, 1974 and he seeks a refund of the deposits he had made. He also asks for damages in the amount of \$20,000 plus interest; and \$2000 for attorney fees.

Bicentennial 2-Dollar Bill Due in April
WASHINGTON — The \$2 bill, discontinued nine years ago, will reappear next spring with the new bicentennial look, the Treasury said recently.

Secretary William E. Simon said the Treasury is planning to issue 50 million \$2 bills on Thomas Jefferson's birthday next April 13. Another 400 million will be released sometime before the nation's 200th birthday on July 4, he said.

Burglars Hit 3 Weimar Firms Early Thurs.
Weimar police, city marshal Fred Vornasand and patrolman Joey Targac, are still investigating three entries of business firms in Weimar during Wednesday night of last week.

Shortly after midnight on the morning of Thurs., Dec. 18th, Weimar city patrolman Joey Targac noted that a door at the Ulbrich's Service Center at the intersection of IH 10 and FM 155 had been broken into and he notified the owner Charles Ulbrich. The two men went into the service station but found nothing missing in the service center. \$200 in cash in a desk drawer also remained intact. Mr. Ulbrich and the officer left the station without repairing the door, a mistake that proved costly later in the morning.

Meanwhile at 2:30, Targac found the door of the Dairy Mart in Weimar had been broken in with a piece of pipe that was left at the scene. Missing from this place were ingredients for a couple of sandwiches.

At six-thirty a.m. Mr. Ulbrich called the Weimar police to report that the food service center had been re-entered, apparently through the broken door, and this time the burglar or burglars took the \$200 which had been left in the desk drawer.

At 8:30 a.m. the Weimar police got a call from Brandt Motor Co. that a side door had been jammed open and employees found things had been moved around, but apparently nothing was taken.

It is believed that the length of pipe used to break open the doors is at least two of the places could have come off a jump truck that was parked near the Ulbrich station during the night.

County Tax Office Will Not Mail Light Damage Out Voter Registration Forms At House Fire Monday

County Tax Assessor and Collector Henry J. Hajovsky informed the Headlight Monday that his office will not be mailing out voter registration forms under the new Voting Rights Act passed by the state legislature.

The tax office received a mailgram this week from the Secretary of State advising that if the time element is such that the office cannot comply with the provision of the law calling for mailing out voter registration applications, then the office has the authority to dispense with mailing.

Mr. Hajovsky said he will begin mailing out new voter registration receipts to all persons who currently are on the list. His office will, however, send out the voter registration application forms to the 800 or so persons who were purged from the county registration list because of the fact that they did not vote in any elections for the past three years.

Included with the application forms will be some form of statement designed to give the voters a better understanding of the reasons for their being purged.

DEPUTIES NEEDED
He added that any person who wishes to qualify as a voter registration deputy should contact him at his office in Columbus where the applicant will be deputized to take voter registrations for the upcoming important presidential election year.
