AWARD WINNERS

In 1975, 597 persons have been named as cooperators. The Colorado SWCD was organized by a vote of the landowners in 1947. Since that time, more than 800 landowners and operators at different times have become cooperators with the district.

The five member board of directors supervises the operations of the district and is concerned with all aspects of the community environment in addition to the planning and

application of conservation practices on the farms, ranches, and other land in Colorado County.

Board meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month in the conference room of the County Agricultural Building in Columbus. All of these meetings are open to the public.

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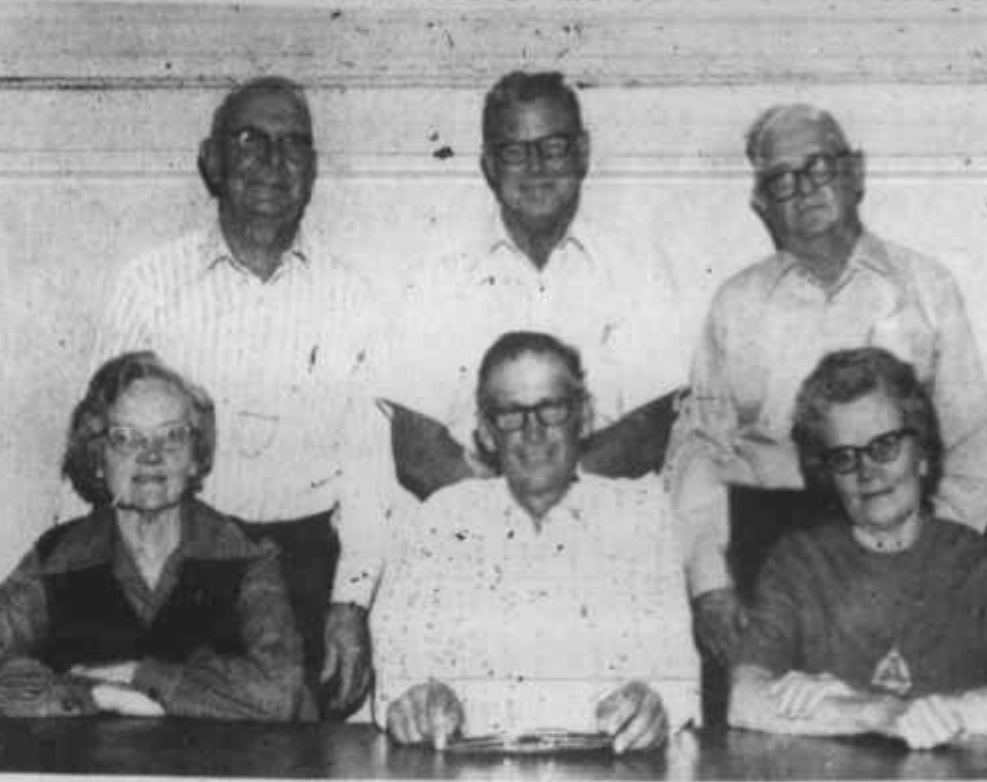

The conservation program in the Colorado SWCD this year. It is called an LTA. Long Term Agreement. This program entails a long-range conservation plan on a farm or ranch that assures the landowner or operator of financing for his plan in the years to come. This is different from most of the other farm programs in that their financing is only on an annual basis and it may change from year to year.

Working together can make the solving of mutual problems easier. For this reason, the District is a member of the Gulf Coast Association of SWCDs and the San Houston Resource Conservation and Development Council. It is the hope of the directors that this area will soon be set up as a RCD project.

The San Houston RCD includes Colorado, Austin, Walter, Montgomery, Harris, Galveston, Ft. Bend, Brazoria, Matagorda and Wharton counties. The purpose is the total development and use of all the resources natural and human - through self government at a local level.

Recreation and wildlife have become a major economic factor in Colorado County. Each year the number of acres that are cropped continues to decline.

The need for a sound soil and water conservation program becomes even more important every year with the increase in the value of land and the need for greater food production to feed an evergrowing world population. Land properly managed and not abused can be of financial benefit to the landowner and to the consumer. Sound conservation benefits everyone.

The Colorado Soil and Water Conservation District directors look forward to working with the community to encourage programs which will help the farmer, rancher, landowner and operator. The cooperation of the Columbus office of the Soil Conservation Service throughout the year has provided great assistance to district cooperators in the planning and application of conservation practices on their farms and ranches.

Christmas Inspires Interesting Customs

Charming customs add to the beauty and meaningfulness of Christmas in Bulgaria. The *kravai*, a large round cake decorated with pastry birds, flowers, and a cross, is brought out with the appearance of the first star on Christmas Eve. The cake is lighted with a candle, and incense is burned while prayers are offered. Then the father and mother of the household break off a piece of cake for good luck.

On Christmas Day, the Yule log is brought in by the father, while other members of the family sprinkle him with corn. This is to insure good health crop. The corn is also placed in a stocking and sprinkled upon the doorstep to insure a happy new year. The Yule log is then lit and the children of the family make wishes as they strike the log.

After church services, Bulgarian children receive their gifts from Grandpa Kaleda, the equivalent of our Santa Claus. The parents in turn receive gifts from their youngsters on the last day of the year.

In Rumania, on the day before Christmas, young boys visit neighboring homes to sing a Christmas greeting, *Colinde*. They are rewarded with apples, cakes, and coins by the listeners. The singing visits begin at dawn and last until after sunset... one can imagine some rather stuffed little boys at the end of the day!

In an ancient Rumanian custom, villagers gather at a river bank clad in biblical costumes for a Christmas carol. A young boy is selected to break the ice that has formed upon the river and a wooden cross is thrown into the water. A scramble then ensues for the rescuer of the cross is assured of good fortune.
