School Board Extends Supt. Contract Makes Changes In Policy Handbook

The Board of Education of the Rice Consolidated Independent School District met in a long session Monday night and among the action items, approved a one year extension to the contract of Supt. E. A. Krickvas on a 5-2 vote; and approved a number of changes in the Policy Handbook for the district; and audited other personnel items.

Mrs. Woody (Mary) Jones of Garwood was a visitor and spoke before the board and discussed some of the concerns of the citizens in the district. Mrs. Jones resigned her position as a long service member of the board and is certified as a cosmetology instructor by the State Board of Cosmetology.

Commr. Court Renews Battle On Fund Division

The time-worn battle over the allocation of county funds to the four precincts, got back into the limelight Monday at the January meeting of the Commissioners' Court when Precinct 3 Commissioner Crockett Lypeydecker renewed his battle for more funds in order to meet the needs of his precinct for this and future years.

Mr. Gates discussed the opinion of the Attorney General, which set out that a precinct has no vested interest in any accumulated surplus and that the commission court must set an amount to be allocated to the precinct for this and future years.

He pointed out that the county will have some \$550,000 available for all four precincts in 1976 and noted that if expenditures continue at the same pace as in the past two years, the revenue will fall below the \$480,000 expected to be available for each precinct.
