VOTERS' REGISTRATIO The voters play the most important part in an

election. Persons who are seventeen years and ten months old at this time, or older, have the privilege of voting for the candidate of their choice if they are registered with the Tax Assessor and Collector's Office. People who have not registered may do so before April 1st to be eligible voters. You have to be registered thirty days before an election.

If you are registered, but have moved within the County, you need to check with your tax office. If it is more convenient for you to register in Eagle Lake or Garwood, you may contact Mr. Fred Frnka at the Engle Lake Headlight, Mr. Gene Brown at The First National Bank and Mr. Joseph Wendel in Eagle Lake; or Mrs. Ed Wine in Garwood. If you are in doubt as to whether you are still an eligible voter, check with your tax office.


