

### Millers' Assn. Gives More Information On New Rice Act

The Rice Millers' Association comes up with some information on the new Rice Production Act which will be in effect on 1976 and 1977 rice crops. This is in addition to information which was reported in an article in last week's paper.

It was noted that only those farmers who had acreage allotments in 1975 are eligible for target price and loan benefits and the eligible farmers must sign up to participate in the program. Farmers without allotments are not eligible for program benefits but they may plant rice with no restriction but must rely on marketplace or contracting financial security. Eligible farmers may exceed allotment and still receive program benefits, but not only on the allotted acres.

The allotment to eligible farmers will be on the basis of the 1975 allotment. If the allotted rice acreage is not planted to rice, the allotment for the following year will be reduced accordingly, but not more than 20 percent.

If at least 80 percent of the farm acreage allotment is planted, the allotment is considered to be 100 percent. If acreage is not planted for two consecutive years, all is lost; however, if the operator declines to accept program payments then the allotment is neither reduced nor forfeited. Acreage planted for 1976 and 1977 in excess of allotment will not be considered in determining future allotments.

**DEFICIENCY PAYMENTS**  
Deficiency payments will be made to cooperators only if the market price falls below the target price of \$6.00 per cwt. of rough rice adjusted to reflect changes in cost of production index during the period from enactment of the bill to July 31, 1976. Farmers would receive deficiency payment from the

operator with set-aside portion of program benefits. Loans and payments are available on planted acreage as well as on set-aside portion of allotments. The set-aside cannot exceed 30 percent of the farm acreage allotment. Land diversion payments on set-aside acreage may be made in addition to loan and deficiency payments. Set-aside acreage may be used for planting other crops or for conservation purposes.

It should be noted however that USDA has announced that there will be no set-aside of allotted acreage for the 1976 rice crop.
