\$200,000 Damages Asked In Death Of Altair Man

A total of \$200,000 in damages are asked by survivors of Freddie Jasper Wilkerson of Altair who died as the result of injuries received in a motor vehicle collision 2.2 miles north of Columbus on Farm Road 109 at 12:15 p.m. on June 23, 1973.

The suit was filed by Elizabeth Needham Wilkerson and others against Werner George Kahlden. The plaintiff alleges negligence on the part of the defendant and asks for the \$200,000 in damages as the result of the death of Wilkerson.

Workman Comp. Asked For Wilks Child

A suit was filed in District Court in Columbus this week in behalf of Frederick O'Neal Wilks by next of kin against the First Employees Insurance Company seeking workman's compensation for the child as the result of the death of his father.

It is alleged in the suit that Frederick was born Aug. 27, 1972 and is a surviving child of Willie B. Washington who was fatally injured in an accident while employed with Gifford Hill and Co., Inc. on May 28, 1975.

The suit asks for workman's compensation in a lump sum payment in the amount of \$70 per week until the child reaches the age of 18.
