Most costs fixed

Krivacka went on to discuss the 1975-76 budget requirements, both revenue and expenditures, and stated that 14% or \$22,000 of the total budget goes to debt service. He added that \$1.6 million or 10% of the total budget goes for salaries. "This means that 64% of the total budget is fixed or obligated," said the superintendent. He said further that another 1 1/2% is dedicated to utilities and 11 1/2% or \$35,000 to replacement of buses, equipment and other items on a systematic basis.

These items take up 99% of the total budget, leaving only 1% or \$10,000 for discretionary expenditures," he commented.

Krivacka cited effective personnel utilization or management as a key item in budget management and called this "a profound responsibility of the administrator." In his effort to get the most education possible for every child for the smallest dollars available.

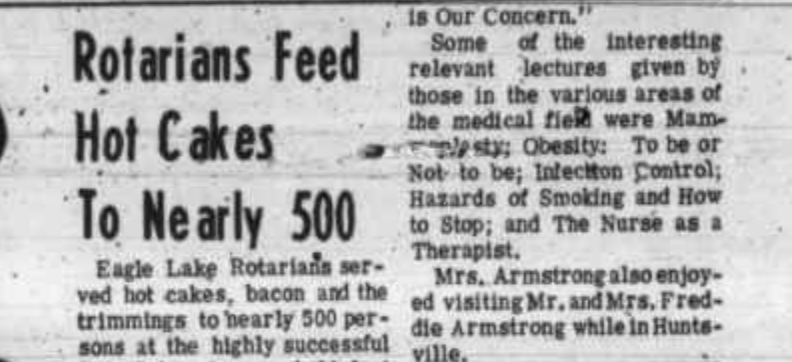

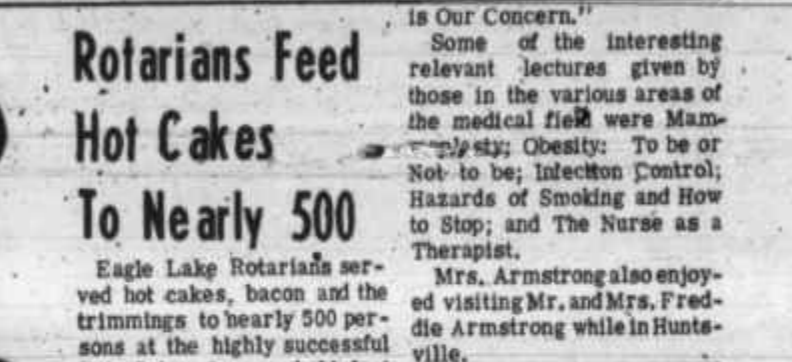
