Ag. Commr. Cautions About Use of 2, 4-D

Agriculture Commissioner John C. White urges all Colorado County farmers who use 2, 4-D and other herbicide to be especially careful this spring and observe regulations for application of that material.

This county is one of 76 of the state which have elected to operate under the regulations administered by the Texas Department of Agriculture.

White reminded farmers that they must have a permit to use herbicide-type herbicides on plots of ten acres or more. On smaller plots, the operator must notify the Texas Department of Agriculture of his intent, prior to spraying. Herbicides can drift during application from the target area and will affect susceptible crops such as cotton and other broad-leaf plants. In addition, fruits, vegetables, and ornamentals can be damaged severely by herbicides. Before applying them, the farmer should check the surrounding fields for susceptible crops. White advised.

He also suggested that a spray pressure of 30 to 50 pounds is best for applications of these herbicides.

Traffic Deaths In Texas Up 13% in 1975

Figures released last week by the Texas Department of Public Safety show that 1975 traffic deaths in Texas rose 13 per cent over 1974, but the toll fell 263 short of the all-time record set in 1973.

Coloel Wilton E. Spier, director of DPS, said a total of 3,419 persons lost their lives last year in 1,945 fatal accidents. The figure compares to 3,046 who died in 2,895 fatal accidents during 1974 and 4,028 who were killed in 1973's 5,074 fatal mishaps.

Spier said the traffic death rate per 100-million vehicle miles was 4.054 last year-up from the 3.6 rate in 1974 but under the 1973 death rate of 4.6.

The DPS director said reports were received on 89,510 injury accidents which resulted in injuries to 139,962 persons. In 1974 there were 85,841 injury accidents and 123,611 injuries, while in 1973 some 87,631 accidents resulted in 122,433 injuries.

Non-injury accidents for 1975 totaled 973,141, compared to 948,127 in 1974 and 973,349 in 1973.
