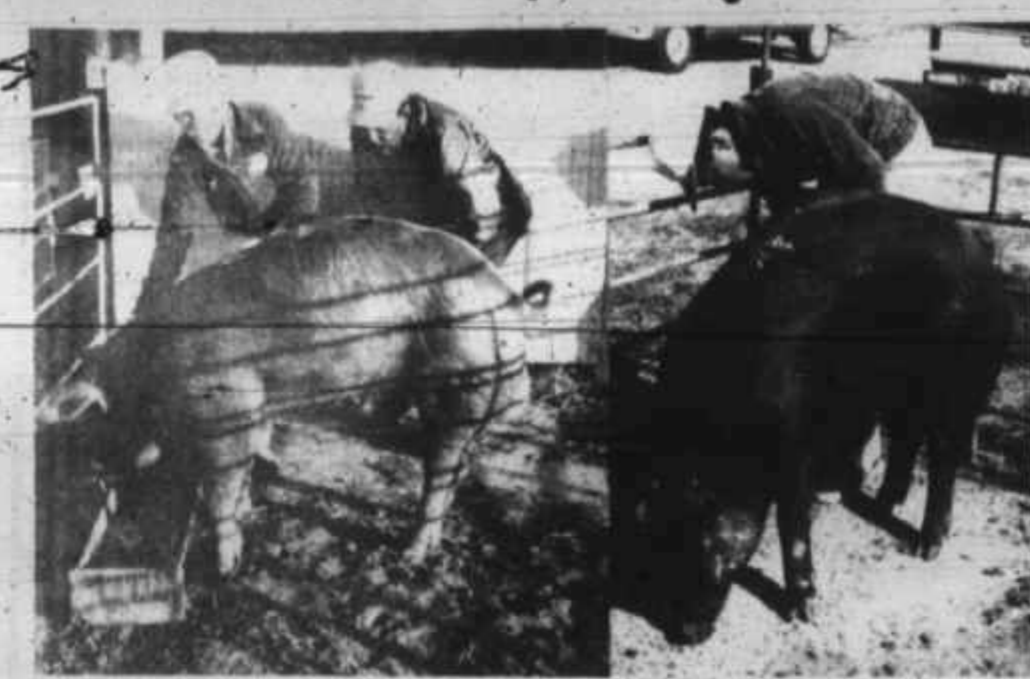


FFA Members Buy Breeding Stock
