

Project Child Find Seeks Out Handicapped Not In School

Do you know of a handicapped child or youth not now attending school? If so, you are urged to contact your local school or call Victor Scott, Director of Special Education, at 234-2513. The Texas Education Agency, working through the Regional Educational Service Centers and each local school district, is currently involved in Project CHILD FIND—a search to locate all handicapped children and youth, ages three through twenty-one, who are not now enrolled in school. Texas public schools are required to identify and locate all children who are handicapped. The purpose of education for all children, regardless of variance in abilities, and, yet, many handicapped children are not being provided with educational opportunities, noted Mr. Scott. "Many parents are unaware that the public school system offers special education programs for their handicapped children. CHILD FIND is a positive unified effort to make that fact known," he said. "Almost every school district in the state will have some eligible children who may be either blind, deaf, speech handicapped, physically disabled, learning disabled, emotionally disturbed or mentally retarded, who are not enrolled in school. Sometimes these handicapped children are being helped by other agencies but their educational needs are not being met. One

Last Rites Held For J. E. Ball Of Rock Is. Mon.

Friends in the area learned with regret of the death of James Edward Ball who died at 1:30 a.m. Friday, April 23 in the Eagle Lake Community Hospital. Mr. Ball served the U. S. Navy in 1927 and served for thirty years and was active in three wars. He was stationed at Pearl Harbor during the time that it was bombed on Pearl Harbor Day. He retired as a chief stowman in 1937 and moved to Houston where he later worked for Cameron Iron Works and retired his position there in 1974.
