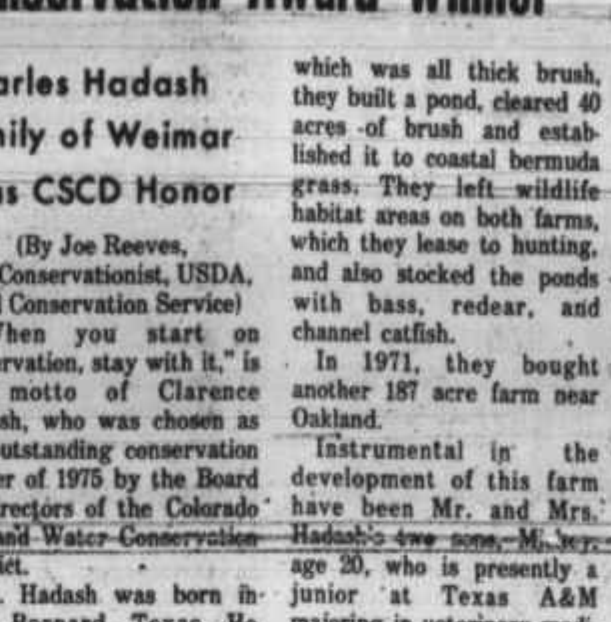

Family Togetherness Demonstrated By Soil Conservation Award Winner

Charles Hadash, Family of Weimar Wins CSCD Honor (By Joe Reeves, Soil Conservation Service)

"When you start on conservation, stay with it," is the motto of Clarence Hadash, who was chosen as the outstanding conservation farmer of 1975 by the Board of Directors of the Colorado Soil and Water Conservation District.

Mr. Hadash was born in East Bernard, Texas. He and his family have attended school at New Britain. At age 14, after his father's death, he had to quit school and take a job hauling milk to help support the family. Because of this, the rest of the family was able to finish school. Mr. Hadash was able to later attend Blinn Junior College in Brenham.

Mr. Hadash served in the United States Marine Corps from 1946 to 1949. On Sept. 5, 1946, he married Anita Otto from Weimar. Mrs. Hadash attended Oak Grove and Weimar High School, graduating in 1947.

Mr. Hadash was a member of Young Farmers. He also worked at the Shell Cycling Plant at Sheridan from 1953 to 1961. Many years of hard work at the plant have earned him just as much of this award as they have spending the rest of their time, when not school, working in the farm.

Hard work, family togetherness, and a common goal of putting good sound soil and water conservation on their land has been the reason for the success of the Hadash family's farming and ranching endeavors.

The Hadash family has developed on their land is an excellent example of what a conservation minded family can accomplish.

Mr. Hadash and his family have been the goal of the Clarence Hadash family since 1959 when they became District Cooperators with the Colorado Soil and Water Conservation District and began to apply sound conservation practices on their two farms.

At that time the farms were owned by Mrs. Hadash's father. They own both farms today.

One farm is 100 acres. On it they built a pond, planted the old cropland fields to coastal bermuda grass, shaped some gullies and crostended.

On the other 80 acre farm, Mr. Reagan's outstanding win in the Texas primary elections held May 1st.
