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Rice HS Athletes Honored at Outstanding Banquet

McDonald Tells Of Benefits From H.S. Athletics

The Rice High School All-Sports Banquet held on Tuesday night of last week in the high school commons was another outstanding event as all boys and girls participating in high school athletics were recognized. The banquet was sponsored by the Outriders, a service organization under the sponsorship of Miss Fran Meyer.

In addition to the recognition of the athletes and a delicious barbecue beef and sausage supper served by Mike's of Columbus, the large gathering on hand for the occasion heard an outstanding and entertaining address by Vernon McDonald, head basketball coach at South Texas State University in San Marcos. Also a special guest at the banquet was Jeff Frank, a graduate of Rice High School and the captain for the Bobcats basketball team for the 1976-77 season. Coach McDonald praised Jeff for his aggressive work with the Bobcats during the past season.

The Bobcat coach, with twenty-five years of experience as a player and coach, stressed the importance of high school athletics to the individual.

"FIGHT TO WIN"

He noted that it is important to work toward being a winner during high school giving one the desire "to fight to win throughout life."

McDonald listed some of the benefits derived from high school athletics among them: sound and energetic work habits; favorable attitudes. He noted that to be a winner one must be a complete athlete with a positive winning attitude. He said high school athletics also develops a good combative attitude.

"Be proud in victory, but do not accept defeat," noted the speaker. "Do your level best and no matter what the outcome you will come out a winner." He emphasized however that there should be only one goal, "to win. Winning is an all the time thing. There should be no room for second place."

McDonald also noted that high school athletes learn loyalty to their school, team and coach, and should have a deep belief in God and be thankful for the abilities given to him as an athlete by God.

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
