anticipated revenue in the water and sewer fund was \$11,083. The report shows that the city had outstanding on Mar. 31, 1976 a total of \$366,000 in bonds and the audit commented that with a total valuation of \$7,304,970 in taxable values, the city has a low per capita debt service of \$38. He estimated the population in 1976 at 2,753, assessed valuation of \$7,304,970; general bonded debt of \$213,000; debt service fund cash and securities at \$71,110 leaving a net bonded debt of \$141,890 or a 19 per cent ratio of debt to assessed valuations. The auditor estimated the city's economic debt margin (or its borrowing power) at \$708,110 commenting that the city is in very good condition in that respect.

pickup also driven east on Highway 90A by James R. Edwards of Alvin. He and the bull were less fortunate. Edwards saw the Petrus car swerve in an attempt to miss the bull and he went to the right of the collision and his right front slammed into the bull causing heavy damage to the car and knocking the bull to the ground in the westbound lane, seriously injured.

The Kingsleys' daughter, Cynthia, competed last summer in the National High School Rodeo Championship Finals, carrying on the tradition of horsemanship exhibited by her father.
