ANNUALLY Local Savings Reach \$4,256,000

Because residents of Colorado County accumulated a record amount of savings in the past year, they are in better financial shape now than they have been for some time.

They saved away a greater proportion of their income than normally, putting much of it into savings banks, savings and loan accounts, U. S. savings bonds and the like.

A considerable part of their unspent cash went, also, toward reducing their outstanding consumer debt, thus improving their financial stability all around.

The amount of new money that the Colorado County population stowed away during the year in various types of savings came to an estimated \$4,256,000.

The finding is based upon national data gathered by the Federal Reserve Board, the Conference Board and other and upon income and spending figures for each area of the country.

The reports show that, for the United States as a whole, personal savings during the past year amounted to nearly \$91 billion, or about 8.3 percent of disposable income after taxes. This compares with \$74 billion the year before, when the rate of saving was 7.5 percent.

The large net rate of savings in the hands of local families represents a treasure trove of additional spending power. When their confidence in the stability of the present economic recovery returns, and they decide the time is right, this pent-up money could spark a big buying spree.

Just how much a family saves or can save depends on its income, its needs and the amount it has left after taking care of the essentials. Families with very small incomes find it difficult to save anything. Families with \$7,500 left after taxes have been putting away about 3.5 percent, on average, those with \$12,000 net, 7.4 percent.

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Rice Exp. Sta. Field Day Today

Significant rice research results will be shown and discussed at Texas A & M's Eagle Lake Research site during the field day activities Thursday, Dr. Jim Stansel, Scientist-in-Charge, announced that field tours will begin at 9 p.m. at the research site located on FM 102 northwest of Eagle Lake. Field day highlights will include a look at the new rice herbicides Bolero and Mo-dorn. Emphasis will be placed on rice diseases and control of the newly released foliar fungicide, Penlate. New potential rice varieties, a wide range of fertilizer management, and EPA rice chemicals as potential pollutants will be shown or discussed says Stansel. The program will end with a very important look at the rice market outlook for 1976-77 given by Dr. Art Gierow, rice economist. Dr. Stansel points out that local support is a key factor in a balanced research program and we are indeed fortunate to have outstanding support of local producers and agribusiness in the area. Johnnie Cooper, County Extension Agent, has organized local rice industry personnel to serve as tour guides during the event. Local agribusinesses have come forward with financial assistance to make the field day program possible which

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
