Columbus Commission Co.

The market was steady on all classes of cattle at the sale at Columbus Livestock Commission Co. on Thursday, July 8, 1976. A lot of buyers on hand. The firm handled 706 head of cattle.

Good to choice butcher calves sold \$5 to \$6; heavier packer cows sold \$5 to \$6; heavy Hereford and Angus steers calves sold \$5 to \$6 and heifers \$2 to \$5 while crossbred steers calves sold \$5 to \$6 and heifers \$2 to \$5.

Good stocker cows and feeders sold \$180 to \$200 per head. Butcher hogs sold 49 to 51 and lambs 25 to 30.

Wharton Livestock Co.

The market was fully steady to one cent higher on all classes of cattle and one to two cents lower on light weight feeder steers at the sale of Wharton County Livestock Commission Co. on Thursday, July 8, 1976.

The firm handled 810 head of cattle and reported steady demand.

Choice stocker and feeder steers weighing 450 to 550 lbs. sold for \$5 to \$6 and 550 to 600 lb. standard steers brought \$5 to \$6. Choice heifers in the \$50 to \$60 lb. range went for \$4 to \$5 and utility slaughter cows brought \$3 to \$4. Choice bulls sold for \$3 to \$5.
