Suit Asks Court To Settle Property Dispute

A suit was filed in District Court in Columbus this week by Frank Amos and wife against Lillian Davis. The petition sets out that the plaintiffs became owners of a plot of land May 15, 1967, but for the past seven years, the defendant has entered upon the property and attempted to deprive the plaintiffs of the use and enjoyment of the land. They allege that the defendant fenced the property and has illegally used the land as a result they ask for removal of a cloud on the title to the land and fair rental on the property on the basis of \$1000 per acre per year.

New 120-Acre Development West of Columbus

Herbert Schroeder, Jr., of Houston announced last week preliminary plans for a development on a 120-acre tract one-quarter mile west of Columbus city limits.

Schroeder recently completed a deal on the property with Chuck Chalmers of Houston. The purchase price, together with basic development costs, has totaled about \$250,000.

The property fronts on I-10 on the south side, S. H. 90 on the north side and Schulenburg Lane (Old Army Road) on the east side. It is accessible to traffic from I-10 or U. S. 90 or Montezuma Street from Columbus.

Schroeder said Mac Ruffino of Columbus had bought 9 acres on the north end of the "property" for a mobile home park. In addition, Ruffino bought tracts of 2.8 acres and 1.8 acres for investment, with one of the sites under consideration as a possible future convenience food location - Colorado County Citizens.
