

Sheltered Workshop, Mental Health Clinic Now Operating

(Continued from page one) persons applied for the school on the opening day and more have enrolled since that time. "Our major problem is in locating these persons," said the speaker, "and this is where you as citizens of the county can assist. You can help us to offer this service to those who are in need of the services available in the workshop."

Mrs. Wagner said that the most pathetic thing about the retarded individual is his or her dependence. "They often depend on some one to tell them when and what to do merely because of the fact that they have never been accepted or allowed to participate in society and activities that others enjoy," she stated.

The speaker explained that at this time the workshop is financed entirely through state funds. While she is the caseworker for contacts in the field, she is also serving at this time as instructor in the work activities because of the inability to locate a qualified person for this position. Funds are available for the additional position.

In response to a question, Mrs. Wagner commented that at this time no county funds are used for the workshop, but indicated that the county might be approached at some time in the future for cooperative aid.

Citizens who know of individuals who could participate in this program are invited to contact Mrs. Wagner at the Columbus Methodist Church or Mr. Scott in this city.

Suit Seeks To Collect Debt Due On Mobile Home

Stuyvesant Insurance Co. filed suit in District Court July 15th against Lalo Gonzales seeking judgment for an alleged debt owed on the purchase of a mobile home Jan. 18, 1973.

The firm alleges that \$3,473.40 is still owed on the home and asks for a judgment in that amount, plus interest and attorney's fees of \$1000 and costs of court.

A collision of two vehicles Jan. 9, 1976 on Interstate 10 a half mile east of Columbus, is the subject of a \$70,000.00 damage suit filed July 20th by Oduy Boyd Hall and wife against Alamo Express, Inc. and others.

The petition alleges that a truck owned by the defendant and driven by Ruben Davis Santos collided with the Hall vehicle causing considerable damage and some injuries.

The plaintiffs ask for \$25,000 for alleged injuries to Sarah G. Hall, plus \$25,000 for injuries to Oduy Hall, plus \$20,000 in damages to the vehicle in which they were riding.

They also ask for interest on the judgment and costs of court.
