In the year 1945, during World War II, a number of momentous occasions took place. One of the most important being on July 26, the Potsdam Conference in Germany, where an ultimatum, the Potsdam Declaration, called upon Japan for an unconditional surrender to the Allies.
Rejecting this declaration, the atomic bomb was used as a weapon of war for the first time in history when dropped from a B-29 bomber on Nagasaki on Aug. 9th and on Hiroshima on Aug. 6th.
After these two happenings the Japanese government announced it would accept the terms of the Potsdam Declaration and ultimatum on Aug. 14 in an Imperial Rescript. World War II was now ended.
Let us not forget the formal document of surrender and communicating this information to the Japanese troops outside their home islands. The formal document of

surrender was signed aboard the battleship U. S. S. Missouri, anchored in Tokyo Bay on Sept. 2. This date was designated as V-J Day (Victory over Japan).

Women of our country may want to fly the flag especially on August 14th, when we were given the right to vote with the passing of the Constitutional Amendment number 19 in 1920.

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Thomases Present Check To Scholarship Fund At Texas A&I

The Texas Historical Commission has awarded \$229,000 in federal matching grants-in-aid to 12 Texas preservation projects. Commission chairman Mrs. Wesley B. Blankenship announced today.
Federal grants-in-aid, made possible under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and channeled to state preservation agencies through a National Park Service, allow each state to distribute funds to local groups for the acquisition or restoration of historic properties listed in the National Register of Historic Places.
Supplemental funds were allocated to Texas to cover the three-month transition period caused by the recent change in the federal fiscal year. Fiscal year 1976 ended June 30 and fiscal year 1977 will not begin until October 1976.
Matching grants awarded from the transition funds will go to the following in the area: Stafford Ranch House in Colorado County (\$65,000); Fayette County Courthouse (\$21,000); and Gonzales County Courthouse (\$15,000). To be eligible for federal preservation grants, sites must be listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Taxes Get Top Billing In Budgets

Where does the money go? How much are Colorado County families spending these days, and for what? Now that the recession is a thing of the past and the rate of inflation is somewhat lower than it was, local residents are in a better spending mood than they have been for some time.
Their incomes are higher than ever, their savings are substantial and their debts are less than usual.
In budgeting themselves, however, before they can determine how much they have available for discretionary spending they have to provide for their basic needs: food, clothing, taxes and shelter.
According to a recent study by the Tax Foundation, a non-profit research organization, taxes are by far the biggest item in most household budgets.
In fact, its figures show, it is not until the average worker has been on the job for four full months of the year that he makes enough to pay his many Federal, state and local taxes.
Applied to Colorado County and to the level of earnings in the area, it means that about "one-third" of the average family's annual income, or approximately \$3,980, is going for taxes.
Related to the 8-hour workday, the overall findings are that taxes take all the money the average worker earns during the first 2 hours and 39 minutes.
As for the rest of the 8-hour day, 1 hour and 32 minutes on the job to pay for housing and household operations, 1 hour and 5 minutes for food and beverages, 39 minutes for transportation costs, 29 minutes for clothing and 25 minutes
