Last Rites For Banker Ellis Miller

Ellis G. Miller, president and chairman of the board of The First State Bank and one of the county's leading figures for more than 50 years, died Friday, July 23 at his home in Columbus. He was 85 years of age. Funeral services were held Sunday, July 25, at the First Baptist Church, with the Rev. Henry L. Teems officiating. Interment was in Oak Grove Cemetery. Columbus Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements. Mr. Miller, one of the area's most active business leaders for more than half a century, was born Jan. 18, 1891, at Oak Grove in Colorado County, the son of Fred G. and Helen Bartels Miller. He was a charter member of the Colorado County Federal Savings and Loan Association at its organization in 1935 and served that institution on its board of directors and as vice president. Mr. Miller was long active in civic organizations and fraternal orders. He is survived by his wife, the former Lavine Hester, whom he married in 1918; one daughter, Mrs. Allan A. Hill of Columbus, and three grandsons, Mark, Stuart and Karl Hill.
