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SPORTS CORNER SPLIT DOVE SEASON TO OPEN IN SOUTH ZONE SEPT. 25TH

Teal Shoot Set
Sept. 18-26th

All day hunting will be in effect for the second year during the split dove season. The season will run Jan. 1-15th.

Bag limits on doves will remain the same as in past years, ten per day with a possession limit of 10 after the first day of shooting. The morning dove season will open to the North Zone of Texas Sept. 1st and run through Oct. 15th with afternoon shooting hours from noon to sunset and the bag limit of 10 morning doves and 10 white doves per day with 20 total possession limit. The first day of shooting for each of the week-ends.

The early teal shooting season will begin on Sept. 18th and continue through Sept. 26th with a daily bag limit of four and possession limit of 10. The first day of shooting for each of the week-ends.
