OK Ambulance Corps Insurance

Insurance for the equipment in the four units of the Colorado County Emergency Ambulance Corps and for the 150 volunteers manning the equipment was approved when the Colorado County Commissioners' Court opened bids at the regular term on Monday of this week. Total cost of the insurance for equipment and for personnel amounted to \$4,470.00 but this does not include the cost of an umbrella policy which may be purchased at a later date. Bids on the insurance were submitted by the Columbus Insurance Agency and the Draper-Anderson Insurance Agency, both of Columbus, and the firms will share in the coverage. Neither was able to submit a bid for umbrella coverage to take care of liabilities or damages in excess of \$100,000-\$300,000 limits at this time, but indicated that they will have bids for consideration of the court at a later date. Draper-Anderson Agency was the low bidder on policies to cover \$100,000-\$300,000 liability on the three vehicles owned by the county and stationed at Eagle Lake, Weimar and Columbus. The unit at Garwood is under title to the Garwood Fire Department and hence it was not included in the liability coverage. The firm bid the \$150.00 for this coverage and \$950.00 for malpractice liability. In other action the court voted to accept a \$32,356.96 lateral road refund from the state to be used only for construction or improvement of lateral roads in this county. It is anticipated that funds will be divided among the four precincts when it is received by the county, presumably at the Sept. meeting. The court accepted the annual report of County Tax Assessor and Collector Henry J. Hajovsky and approved a \$47,332.12 delinquent personal property roll for county and state taxes; a \$674.30 supplementary roll to be added to the original tax roll; a list of \$2,311.39 in errors in assessments; and a total of \$10,336.66 in delinquent taxes on lands and lots in this county. The final lists were for the tax year ending June 30, 1976 and were for the 1975 tax roll. New Alcoholism Program The court approved a change in the agency for participation in alcoholism services. Originally this county was included in a 12-county area called the Houston Regional Council on Alcoholism and the new agency to which the county is assigned is the Fort Bend Alcoholism Services, Inc. and includes this county and Austin, Wharton, Fort Bend, and Matagorda counties only. Precincts 1, 2 and 4 of this county provide \$300 each quarter to the alcoholism services for a one year basis ending Sept. 30, 1976. Participation in the program is expected to be brought up before the court at that time. Seagull Pipeline Corp. was granted approval to lay pipelines across Hunt Lane and the Glen Flora Road which will be FM 3013 in the future, in Precinct 4. Authority was given for the purchase of election supplies for the November general election; and the court concurred with the acceptance of a \$14,420 federal grant made available to the 25th Judicial District for a Juvenile Probation Officer. District Judges recommended acceptance of the grant. Budget Hearing Sept. 13 The date for the annual hearing on the 1977 budget for Colorado County was set for 2 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 13, the date of the next regular meeting. The court approved on a 3-1 vote the calling for a new contract for pest control services at the county jail. The original contract with Bugman, Inc. was for two years at a cost of \$144 per year, but the last year contract was for \$180 per year. The court will act on the contract at the next meeting. Precinct 4 Commissioner Bill Stiles voted against getting a new contract. He had expressed opinion in the past that personnel of the department could adequately handle the chores. School Funds Divided The court approved the division of \$17,000 in funds from the Permanent School Fund, maturing at this time, to the three school districts operating in the county, Rice District, Columbus and Weimar on the same ratio that has been used in previous divisions of maturing permanent school funds. County Judge Crane read a report from the probation officer serving the four-county 25th Judicial District. It was noted that in Gonzales there are 156 adults on probation, an increase of 25 from a report prior to April 1975; 100 in Colorado County, 17 less than the past quarter; 109 in Lavaca county, 4 less than previously; and 238 in Guadalupe county, a drop of 24. This report period was from April 15 to June 14th. Bounty Report Judge Crane reported that \$5 bounties were paid on 20 wolves killed in this county during the month of July. Refinancing could produce this year's most important "cash crop."
