SHERIFF'S REPORT

Require Positive Identification In Cashing Checks

I would like to take this opportunity to again remind all our citizens to be real careful when cashing a check for someone or accepting a check for payment of merchandise. Look at the check real close and make sure it is filled out properly. Require positive identification before cashing a check. Ask for and write the driver's license number of the person cashing the check. Write that number on the check itself. If the person cashing the check does not have a driver's license, ask for their social security number and write that information on the check along with the person's date of birth and address. If they refuse to give you this information it would be wise not to cash the check. Require positive identification.

County Re-Invests \$300,000 In Two CD's

Colorado County Commissioners' Court, in session Monday, authorized County Auditor M. L. Briscoe to re-invest a total of \$300,000 in certificates of deposit for 99 days at the rate of 14.5 percent interest. The funds are budgeted but are not needed at the present time. A certificate of deposit in the amount of \$275,730.20 matured on August 10th. \$57,300 in road and bridge class 2 and \$45,000 in road and bridge special were cashed in and will be distributed equally among the four commissioners' precincts. Re-invested were: \$50,000 in Precinct 1 road and bridge, \$45,000 in the general fund, and \$10,800.20 in a contingency fund, plus \$70,000 in ad valorem unallocated. Interest from the unallocated funds will go into the contingency fund for distribution on the basis of need at a later date. Another certificate for \$145,229.38 will mature August 21st and the court took the following action on these funds: \$50,000 in the jury fund was re-invested, \$3,067.37 in the contingency fund was re-invested, \$86,162.01 in the right-of-way fund, re-invested, and \$20,000 in additional ad valorem precinct 1 was cashed in and \$30,000 was re-invested. A total of \$117,680 plus interest earned for the last 99 day period will be included in the certificate from funds maturing August 10th and \$125,229.38 plus interest earned in the past 99 days is included in the certificate from funds maturing August 21st.

Rotary Hears Report On South Texas Nuclear Power Project

Bob Noster, public relations director for Central Power and Light Company for the South Texas Project, was the speaker for the program of the Eagle Lake Rotary Club at noon on Wednesday of last week. Noster was introduced by local CPL manager, Frank Sherrer. He told the gathering that the South Texas Project, a nuclear electric generating facility, is a joint venture of Central Power and Light Co., Houston Lighting and Power, the City Public Service Board of San Antonio and the City of Austin. CPL has a 25.2 percent interest in the project and is the project manager. He noted that the first phase of the facility when completed in 1980 will generate 1250 megawatts of electricity. A second unit of equal capacity is scheduled for completion in 1982. "To give you some idea of the capabilities of the plant when completed, the 2500 megawatts will be as much as CPL currently generates at all of its facilities," said Noster, but he added that the company has only 25.2 percent interest and hence will get that proportionate amount of the power produced. The two 1250 megawatt plants will be sufficient to handle total requirements of a city of the size of San Antonio. In addition to CPL's 25.2 percent interest, Hous. Light-Power holds a 30.8 percent interest. San Antonio public services 28 percent and the city of Austin 16 percent. Noster showed slide film to illustrate his discussion on the progress being made on the plant which is under construction on the western side of the Colorado River in Matagorda County on a 2,300-acre site. Five hundred of the acres will be devoted to the plant and 7,000 acres to a man-made cooling reservoir for the plant. Other property at the site will be designated for recreational use and for a market was about steady with a weak undertone on all classes of cattle except slaughter-cows which were on the strong side at the Wednesday, Aug. 4th sale.
