WEATHER OUTLOOK THROUGH SATURDAY: Scattered showers are likely for the Texas Rice Belt through Saturday. Some rains of an inch or more are likely, especially in the Eastern Rice Belt. Temperatures will show little day to day with inland highs in the 90's and lows in the upper 60's and low 70's.

MANAGEMENT: The good chances for rain this week considered when planning farming and ranching activities. The return of showery weather will spread the many plant diseases so farmers should spray programs to insure that peanuts and soybeans are protected. The morning hours will be suitable for spraying but again, the chance of showers should be considered when scheduling spraying.

AND HARVESTING: Hay that is ready should be harvested of rice, cotton and corn should be avoided problems caused by rains or excess moisture.

LEAF SPOT: The nighttime weather has been too the rapid development of peanut leaf spot disease, the return of showery weather and higher nighttime temperatures will favor the rapid development of leaf spot late in the week.

WEATHER: A few late afternoon and evening showers or showers were observed in the Eastern Rice Belt but the only significant rain amounts reported were Liberty and 0.90 at Beaumont. Afternoon highs Monday in the low 90's in inland locations and morning lows in the upper 60's and low 70's.

9.25 cents lb., preliminary 8.94; Broken Rice, all classes, final 4.75, preliminary 4.60 cents per pound.

Premium and discounts and location differentials remain unchanged from those previously announced.

\$8.25 target price
The final target price for 1976-crop rice will be \$8.25 per hundredweight. This is \$0.25 per hundredweight higher than the preliminary rate of \$8.00 per hundredweight for rough rice, also announced April 20. The final target price level was also determined by adjusting the preliminary rate for the increase in the index of prices paid by farmers for production items, interest, taxes and wage rates during the period February through July 1976.

A deficiency payment will be paid to eligible producers should the final target price exceed the higher of the loan level or the national weighted average market price received by farmers for the first five months of the marketing year (August through December 1976). The payment received will be the payment rate times the allotment times the established yield.

Possession Of Marijuana Charged Here

An Eagle Lake man was charged with misdemeanor possession of marijuana, less than two ounces, following his arrest at a house here at 8:45 a.m. Wed., Aug. 18th.

Officers obtained a search warrant issued by Judge M. M. Jones and entered the house and found several lids of marijuana and 12 rolled cigarettes. Participating in the arrest were Acting Chief of Police Buford Ashley, City Patrolman Steve Skinner and State Game Warden Sam Center.

The charged man, Louis Ray Barrow, will face the possession charge in county court.

Rice Prices Holding Near \$7.20 Cwt

Top rice bids in sales here last Wednesday and Monday of this week are holding at the \$7.20-\$7.25 cwt. mark. 900,000 cwt. have been offered for sale to date at the local office and Donald Obenhaus, manager, said that about 95 per cent of the rice meeting loan value is being sold.

The local office of the American Rice Growers Cooperative Association expects another big sale this Wednesday and then the sales should begin tapering off slightly.

On Wednesday of last week, 18 lots of rice totaling 124,159 cwt. went up for bids and the top bid of the day, \$7.20 per cwt., went to a lot of LaBelle grown by the M. C. Theuman estate and Riviana and P&S posted equal bids. The lot milled 64-70 No. 1 land had loan value of \$7.22. Monday of this week, 31 lots of rice totaling 195,296 cwt. went up for bids and the top bid of \$7.25 per cwt. was made by Riviana for LaBelle rice grown by the M. C. Theuman estate. The lot milled 65-71 No. 1 and had loan value of \$7.33.
