New School Bus Is Ordered

Rice High School has just ordered a new school bus which is to be delivered in February of next year and will cost somewhere around the neighborhood of \$15,199.

E. A. Kravacka, who is the superintendent of Rice, is also the person who supervises the transportation for Rice's students.

Every school day 735 students are bused to their homes, and this includes all elementary students. Approximately 750 miles are traveled a day by all the buses and 150 miles for extracurricular activities. The approximate cost per mile for one bus is 25 cents to 30 cents a mile. Multiply that by 750 and you get a fairly impressive figure, about \$44,000 per year.

There are four new bus drivers now, and they are Winn Hollas, Dudley Latimer, Mrs. Jack Axel and Sidney Frey.
