REFLECTIONS ON International Sunday School Lesson

(Romans 6:12-23)

Several years ago, an outstanding novelist decided to run for political office. He wrote under a pen name and did not want to use that name politically. He purchased a residence in the city he wanted to run for state office from. After having established his residence, he registered for the political race. He was still maintaining his home in a nearby city and writing from that city. He and his family were only spending part of each week in the new home. His political advisor told him: "If you are going to run from this district you need to really live among these people. You are going to have to decide who you are and where you are from immediately."

Most of us do not face this problem in the same sense he did. We do face the problem of knowing who we are and where we are from in emotional and spiritual ways though. Most of us look at ourselves and wish that "we could have a new beginning in another world." One of the major themes in the New Testament is that God offers people a new life. Jesus talked about "being born anew or born from above." Paul developed the idea that we are so changed by God that it is like "becoming a new creation." In the sixth chapter of Romans, he compares this new life to dying and taking on a new life. He says that Christians are to live like they have received a new life from God.

This new way of living grows out of a personal relationship to God. It means that we submit our lives to the authority of Christ to the point that we actually view ourselves as his servants or

24th Hereford Sale At Columbus Tues.

The Gulf Coast Hereford Association will hold its 24th annual fall sale Tuesday, Oct. 19 at the Memorial Park Arena in Columbus.

Eighty registered Herefords have been consigned to this sale. There will be 83 horned bulls, ranging in age from 20 months to 4 years, with a good number calving in the spring of 1975.

Ten horned heifers have been consigned, five calves in the spring of 1974 and the other five calves in the fall of 1974. These heifers are coming from three different herds, and all 10 are being pasture exposed.

The cattle are clean pedigreed; are acclimated to Gulf Coast conditions and will be tested for brucellosis and TB to meet health requirements to move into any area. They will sell in single lots and in pens of two

Lions Hear R2R Program By Vera Brown

Mrs. Vera Brown met with the Eagle Lake Noon Lions last week and presented a very interesting and informative program concerning the R2R (Right to Read) Program. This program involves a comprehensive testing of children in grades one through five, and features the better utilization of existing materials to effect a gain in reading skills. The Eagle Lake Primary School, the pilot school for this area, reflected pretest scores similar to those of other communities representing a cross-section of students.

Mrs. Brown urged parents to read to their children and let their children see them reading as 80% of the pupils' motivation potential, attitudes, work habits, and cultural self-expectations are reached by the time that the pupil enters school. Lack of early motivation is the greatest single cause of a child having reading problems, according to Mrs. Brown. Nutritional deficiencies during early childhood was cited as another contributor to reading problems.
