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Proposed Dog Ordinance

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF ALL DOGS WITHIN THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, TEXAS, AND PROVIDING A FEE THEREFOR, PROVIDING THAT ALL DOGS BE VACCINATED AGAINST RABIES, PROVIDING FOR A CITY DOG POUND MASTER OF OWNERSHIP, PROVIDING FOR ITS REGISTRATION, PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A POUNDMASTER AND PROVIDING FOR THE DETENTION OF DOGS HAVING BEEN BITTEN A PERSON, PROVIDING AN OFFENSE FOR REMOVAL OF LICENSE TAGS; PROVIDING AN OFFENSE FOR DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE OR NOT RESTRAINED; PROVIDING FOR DOG OWNERSHIP FORBID- DING; PROVIDING FOR DOGS AND DANGEROUS DOGS; PROVIDING FOR BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS; PROVIDING FOR NUISANCE; REPEALING THE EXISTING ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00); AND PROVIDING A SAVING CLAUSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, TEXAS: SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person within the limits of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, to own, keep, possess, harbor or allow to remain upon premises under his control, any dog, male or female, without having registered the same as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. The fee for such registration shall be One Dollar (\$1.00) per year for each dog, payable in advance. All registrations shall expire March 31st and shall not be issued for less than one (1) year.

SECTION 3. No registration shall be issued for any dog owned, kept, possessed, harbored or allowed upon the premises of any person and under his control unless said dog shall have first been vaccinated against rabies; within twelve (12) months prior to the issuance of such license. There shall be delivered to the Tax Assessor-Collector of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, prior to the issuance of such license, a signed certificate showing that said dog has been duly vaccinated, giving the date of vaccination, and thereafter, upon payment of the fee as provided herein, the City Tax Assessor-Collector shall then issue a registration for said dog.

SECTION 4. Upon payment of such registration as provided herein, the City Tax Assessor-Collector shall issue a receipt, registration and number metal tag. Such metal tag shall be securely fastened in some manner to such dog. The City Tax Assessor-Collector shall keep a register of all registrations issued in which shall be entered the name of the applicant, description of the dog, the number of the registration and the tag issued and the date of issuance and expiration.

SECTION 5. The City Manager shall appoint for a period to be terminated at his pleasure, a qualified person to act as the City Dog Pound Master, whose duty it shall be to see that the provisions of the ordinance are enforced. For his services the Pound Master shall receive such compensation as shall be fixed by the City Council.

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the Pound Master or any police officer of the City

meeting, and if such court shall determine at said hearing that such dog is vicious or dangerous to persons or other animals, the Court may order that such dog be kept muzzled, or that such dog be kept within a sufficient enclosure, or moved outside the corporate limits of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, or that such dog be delivered to the Chief of Police or Pound Master and be destroyed. The Chief of Police or Pound Master is hereby authorized to impound any dog which is accused of being vicious pending the results of a court hearing. If any dog attacks, bites or attempts to bite any person, dog or other animal while such dog is running at large, then such dog shall be conclusively presumed to be vicious and dangerous dog. If any vicious or dangerous dog so found cannot be taken up and impounded with reasonable safety for the person attempting the same, such dog may be slain by any policeman or other authorized city agent.

SECTION 7. If the owner of any dog so found shall not apply to the Pound Master and pay such fees as herein provided within seventy-two (72) hours from the time such dog is confined in the City Pound, the Pound Master is hereby authorized to sell such dog at private sale, and the proceeds of such sale shall be deposited with the City Secretary-Treasurer and credited to the general fund of the City. In the event the owner fails to claim such dog within the time provided by this ordinance, and the Pound Master is unable to sell such dog, it shall be the duty of the Pound Master to destroy same.

SECTION 8. Should any person be bitten by any dog, such dog shall be immediately placed in the City Pound, or confined in some reputable building kennel or animal hospital for a period of fourteen (14) days for observation.

SECTION 9. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove any metal tag issued under the provisions of this ordinance from any dog without the written consent of the owner of such dog.

SECTION 10. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any dog owned, possessed, kept, or harbored by him to be at large unless leashed and under control on the streets, alleys, or public places or on private premises not under the control of said owner, within the limits of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas. (b) Any person must restrain such dog on his own property by one of the following methods: (1) In an adequate pen, (2) In an adequate leash or chain, (3) Within the confines of a house, or (4) By personal attendance to such dog when dog is free of other restraints. Any police officer of the City of Eagle Lake may enforce the above requirements by citation, but no dog may be taken into private property without the permission of the property owner except in an emergency declared by the Chief of Police, City Manager, or acting Mayor.

SECTION 11. Any handicapped person having special need of a dog may apply to the City Council for permission for that particular condition.

SECTION 12. If any dog shall bite, scratch or otherwise attack any person, and the person attacked was not at the time trespassing upon the property of the owner or molesting the person having control of such dog, or if a canine animal proved beyond a reasonable doubt that the person so attacked was provoking or teasing such dog, then Corporation Court of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, shall have the authority to order and hold a

meeting, and if such court shall determine at said hearing that such dog is vicious or dangerous to persons or other animals, the Court may order that such dog be kept muzzled, or that such dog be kept within a sufficient enclosure, or moved outside the corporate limits of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, or that such dog be delivered to the Chief of Police or Pound Master and be destroyed. If any vicious or dangerous dog so found cannot be taken up and impounded with reasonable safety for the person attempting the same, such dog may be slain by any policeman or other authorized city agent.

SECTION 13. If the owner of any dog so found shall not apply to the Pound Master and pay such fees as herein provided within seventy-two (72) hours from the time such dog is confined in the City Pound, the Pound Master is hereby authorized to sell such dog at private sale, and the proceeds of such sale shall be deposited with the City Secretary-Treasurer and credited to the general fund of the City. In the event the owner fails to claim such dog within the time provided by this ordinance, and the Pound Master is unable to sell such dog, it shall be the duty of the Pound Master to destroy same.

SECTION 14. Should any person be bitten by any dog, such dog shall be immediately placed in the City Pound, or confined in some reputable building kennel or animal hospital for a period of fourteen (14) days for observation.

SECTION 15. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove any metal tag issued under the provisions of this ordinance from any dog without the written consent of the owner of such dog.

SECTION 16. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for the first violation, Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for the second violation, Forty Dollars (\$40.00) for the third violation. Eighty Dollars (\$80.00) for the fourth and then not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the fifth and thereafter.

SECTION 17. If any dog shall bite, scratch or otherwise attack any person, and the person attacked was not at the time trespassing upon the property of the owner or molesting the person having control of such dog, or if a canine animal proved beyond a reasonable doubt that the person so attacked was provoking or teasing such dog, then Corporation Court of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, shall have the authority to order and hold a

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SECTION 20. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove any metal tag issued under the provisions of this ordinance from any dog without the written consent of the owner of such dog.
