Cong. Pickle Discusses Possible Tax Cut

There is more and more talk about another tax cut next year. In a way, this talk may be premature. It is a fact of life, however, that when high ranking officials say "tax cut," it is hard to stem the public excitement. So it may turn out that many people who are already counting extra money.

Perhaps a better approach would be to look at the economy as a whole, and to attempt to realistically gauge the possible effects of another tax cut. After the hard recession of 1974 and most of 1975, our economy seemed to be turning around the first three months of 1976. Many experts credit part of this turn around to the tax cut Congress enacted in 1975, and continued through 1976. In the past three months the economic recovery picture has turned gloomier. If the trend continues, I think that the Federal government will try to correct the situation. This is why we hear the tax cut talk.

A tax cut can be a real gamble. A tax cut can both lower revenues and raise revenues, depending on its impact. If the tax cut does not spur greater employment, and only lowers revenues, then the government deficit is bigger, which in turn means that there is more inflation. Inflation is public enemy number one, and we don't need to do anything that might add to inflation. If the tax cut spurs the economy, and there is more employment, then government revenues actually go up as the result of the tax cut. This is what happened as a result of the 1975 tax cut. More people went back to work, more taxes were paid, the government deficit was less than inflation, and inflation slowed down from the incredible levels of 1975 and 1974.
