Rudy Lopez, Alex Woolridge, Julian Flores, Sr., and Charles L. Spallinger. It was noted that the objective of the Community Development Program is to "provide decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income." At the present time, there is a \$100,000 limit on the programs approved by HUD, but there is some hope to get that increased to \$200,000 noted city manager T. J. Smith.

Engineer Reports on Study
Accompanying Mr. Griffith to the council meeting on Tuesday night of last week was Mr. Woolridge and Mr. Lopez. Also present was Dan Kennedy, representative of the engineering firm of O'Malley & City of Brenham and Rosenberg, which worked with the city in its application for \$97,000 under the 1976 program for sewer extensions to the western part of the city not now serviced by sanitary sewer system. The funds for this project have been approved and final preparation is being made to bring the project before prospective bidders.

Mr. Kennedy had done a preliminary survey of the drainage problem. The deep drainage ditch intersects East Main just east of the S&W Parts and Service Stop property, and water flows south in the ditch through the residential area along 4th and E Streets and front of the Eagle Lake Primary School. Due to the depth of the ditch some concern has been expressed by residents along the ditch and also by interested citizens and school officials concerning the hazard posed by the ditch and the threat that some child might be injured or even lose his life in the ditch which carries heavy amount of water during heavy rainy periods.

Kennedy offered to the council three alternatives to consider in remedying the project. The first of these would be to concrete line the bottom and sides of the ditch along A street and on E street in front of the school and be estimated costs for this would be in the neighborhood of \$170,000. Another alternative would be to install three 54-inch drainage pipes to carry the water and to cover these to eliminate the ditch. Estimated cost for this would be around \$250,000. The last alternative would be to use a grade-alike or similar equipment to clean the ditch and

improve sloping. No estimate was given on this, but it would be far less than the other alternatives.

The council charged the engineering firm with the responsibility of determining the exact boundaries of the ditch and of property lines since there is some dispute at this time as to whose ditch the property is on, city or private ownership. The council also asked the engineering firm to determine the point in the project where the work could be carried out, under either of the alternatives if funds were not available this year for completing the entire project.

Other Council Action

In other action the council voted to accept a water line which Roy Dean Van Nort and John Perry plan to lay in highway right of way to service Van Nort's Rice Courts and Perry's anticipated new building location on Highway 90A.

It is anticipated that the work will be started by the highway department within the immediate future and will bring definite relief from the problem that has existed for a long time.

Duck Season Ends Sunset Sun.

The first portion of the 1976-77 duck hunting season will come to an end at sunset (this Sunday), Nov. 20th, however all ducks remain in season through January 23, 1977.

Duck season will be closed Nov. 20th through Dec. 10th and the ducks will come back into season at one-half hour before sunrise on Dec. 11th and both ducks and geese remain in season through January 23.

Hunting club operators report that both duck and geese kills have been very good during the past two weeks, after the season got off to a dismal start with only light geese legal targets for the first two weeks of hunting.

Deer continue in season and will remain legal targets through January 23, 1977. Also legal at this time are quail which are in season and will remain so through Feb. 13th.

Wilson Jackpots may be hunted through Feb. 13th with a daily limit of eight, and possession limit of 16.

Squirrel are in season all year long in this county with a daily limit of ten and possession limit of twenty.

Mourning doves are out of season at this time but will return for an all-day shooting period from January 1st through 10th.
